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
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




## A postcard and so much more.

"The Mehari Club was founded 40 years ago in Cassis.

The club was founded by the children of the Citroën dealer in the heart of the village, who understood before anyone else that the Mehari was something very special. They set about customising it. Today, we restore 2CVs and Mehari cars. But above all, we remake spare parts for these cars, and in particular we make a lot of them locally.

Here in Cassis, we have workshops for upholstery and metalwork. We have also unveiled the first electric Méhari, the EDEN, with the Origine France garantie certification! We are committed to preserving our expertise, and as such we have been awarded the Living Heritage Enterprise label."

**Guided tours of the Mehari Club workshops,**

**April to September.** The tour covers the various car workshops: upholstery production, chassis manufacturing line, metal workshops, reconstruction or electrification of old vehicles. To round off the visit, the tour takes you around the exhibition of historical models that have made the double-chevron marque (Citroën) so famous.


"Cassis is a unique treasure trove that gives our region its distinctive character. Situated on the outskirts of Marseille, Cassis is a cove looking out to sea, a rocky barrier with a unique colour. The living environment here is exceptional. The Ferme Blanche estate is a family business that was founded in 1714. We produce all 3 colours of wine and have been organic since 2016. In 2024, we completely redesigned the cellar to make it more accessible to visitors, with a terrace overlooking the vineyards, tasting sessions, seminars and social events. A taste of the easy-going lifestyle in Cassis."

**Tasting sessions overlooking the vineyards.** At La Ferme Blanche, visitors get to do more than just stop off at the cellar. They can enjoy the estate's terrace overlooking the vineyards, and settle down in the lounge to discover the estate's wines, including organic whites, rosés and reds. 

**The workshop that transforms the treasures of the sea.** Jonas, the fisherman, and his wife Gaëlle, a jewellery designer and creator, have opened this little gem of a shop together. # THE CASSIS VINEYARDS



**The Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée Cassis which will celebrate its 90th anniversary in 2026, is the oldest of the Appellations in France.**

But you have to go back nearly 2,600 years, when the Greek colonies settled here, to tell the long story of winemaking in Cassis. As the centuries have gone by, the winemakers have learnt from this special region, and adapted their grape varieties and practices to produce a unique wine today, showing the greatest respect for the soil.

There are ten estates, situated in a veritable amphitheatre that opens up on to the sea, and rises up to an altitude of between 10 and 200m. Some are gently sloping, others climb up in restanques (terrace cultivation), all benefit from the breeze, 3,000 hours of annual sunshine and low rainfall, mainly in the spring and autumn. The Cassis winemakers have shown a real commitment, and have resisted the call of the property developers, and turned towards organic wines. With passion, they watch carefully each day over the quality of their wines, respectful of tradition while adopting new techniques.



The vineyard is entirely integrated into the Calanques National Park.



## Cassis, land of white wines

Pride of the AOC Cassis, the white wines represent the major part of the production and contribute greatly to its reputation. The white wines of Cassis have a light-yellow colour with bright reflections. They give off their sweet citrus and white flower scent, enhanced by iodine notes, the imprint of their terroir. After a few years in the cellar, the aromas become more complex around a generally honeyed note. Round and lively on the palate, leaving an intense and wonderfully balanced freshness, typical of the wines of Cassis.

# CASSIS, NATURE AT ITS BEST

From the ochre and golden Cap Canaille to the famous white limestone Calanques, the Cassis coastline is unique, and absolutely unmistakable. Nature is grandiose here, everywhere you look, the colours explode, the landscapes amaze, the vegetation reigns and the superlatives abound. Cap Canaille is the highest maritime cliff in Europe, the Calanques Park, the Number One nature discovery park, Cassis stone was used for the quays of Alexandria, the Route des Crêtes that goes from Cassis to La Ciotat is simply “stunning”. Cassis has outstanding nature and strives to protect it.



## The Calanques National Park.

Established in 2012, this is the largest peri-urban park in Europe, covering land and sea. 90% of the park's 158,000-hectare footprint is maritime.

Seawards, the Calanques National Park offers an exceptional heritage. This protected wild paradise is home to several rare species such as the Herbe à Gouffé (*Arenaria provincialis*), the noble pen shell, the hatpin urchin; and further out to sea bottlenose dolphins and loggerhead turtles can be seen.

Landwards, the biodiversity is remarkable, more than a hundred protected plant and animal species have taken up residence there: Bonelli's eagles, yellow-legged gulls, and European free-tailed bats. The Calanques and Cap Canaille area are a great place for hiking, rock climbing, diving, sea-kayaking...

The Calanques National Park is a young park (the Vanoise, which was the very first park, dates back to 1963), and there is still a great deal to be done to adapt the site to the challenges of conservation and regulating traffic flows. New paths and new developments are being continually explored.

## Esprit Parc label rolled out in Cassis.

All producers and service providers located in the National Parks who meet the accession requirements set by the National Parks can attain the Esprit Parc national brand. The brand is an additional guarantee of authenticity for visitors. in addition to leisure activities, the Hôtel Les Volets Rouges has been awarded the prestigious label. This 2-star establishment located in the hills, has also been awarded the Green Key label.





## The Cassis boatmen

are now offering longer tours to limit the carbon footprint of their journeys, by encouraging tourists to explore the area in greater depth and limiting the use of short, comparatively more energy-consuming journeys. Most of the boats are hybrid so that they can switch off their internal combustion engines when approaching sensitive sites and cause minimal disturbance to wildlife. A stop-off point opposite the Anse de l'Arène invites visitors to take a dip in the water, in the right place at the right time. Special mention for the "evening swim aperitif" outings. For groups or families, there is also the option of hiring a private boat with a skipper. The fleet boasts the "**Esprit Parc National**" label. Follow the flag! New from February 2025: online tour bookings.

## Just one address, the Calanques Guide Bureau.

The Calanques Guide Bureau is staffed exclusively by high altitude mountain guides, mid-altitude mountain leaders and climbing instructors. It is the ultimate resource for discovering the area, combining safety and knowledge of the environment. Hiking, multi-pitch climbing, climbing for "all levels", via cordata... The bureau's guides will reveal their favourite spots and anecdotes.

## New sea shuttles

To facilitate pedestrian access to the Calanques, electric boat shuttles are being considered between the port of Cassis and the Port Miou Calanque (Presqu'île), with service scheduled to begin in spring 2026.

## Educational family hikes, 2 landscapes, 2 options to choose from.


The "**Petit Prince**" trail is a one-hour stroll around the Presqu'île, bordering the "Calanque de Port Miou" cove. For the curious, there are information panels explaining the Calanques and their biodiversity.

New in 2024, the **Mussuguet** trail, an effortless one-hour stroll through the hills to reveal the secrets of Cassis stone.

## Kayaking or paddle-boarding, up close with nature.

Drifting without a sound in a kayak or on a paddle-board through breathtaking scenery is undoubtedly one of the most exhilarating experiences to be enjoyed along the park's coastline. Early in the morning, at sunset, on your own or with a guide, there are many options to choose from. Two professionally trained partners take their privileged visitors down to the turquoise waters and up close to the limestone rocks.






## CASSIS AND ITS LEGENDARY PLACES

There are certain addresses that define a place, and become part of it.

Establishments past and present, they have become an integral part of Cassis.

They are run by people who are passionate about Cassis, its region, its land and its deep blue sea, and who want you to see and experience the very best of the destination.



### The new life of Le Liautaud 4\*.

Since 1870, the letters of its sign have been a prominent feature against the Cassis sky. A genuine landmark in the village, the establishment has reopened after extensive renovations, recapturing the luxury of the 1950s. This charming hotel draws its inspiration from the memories of this golden age to create a décor that is pure, mineral and elegant. The thirty or so rooms evoke the colours of Cassis, and the colour of its stone.

The experience begins at the Café Liautaud, with one of the most beautiful terraces in the village, overlooking the harbour and its endless ballet of visitors and boats. The brasserie, run by chef Katy Orlando since June 25, is a return to basics, with traditional, seasonal recipes in the spirit of a bistro.

As you make your way upstairs a stop at the tea room is a must. This cosy setting is a delightful balcony overlooking the harbour, where you can share delicious home-made pastries, accompanied by teas and other drinks carefully selected by the house.

Climb a little further and the roof terrace unveils the most magnificent view of Cassis, the harbour, the open sea and the Château de Cassis. The panorama is truly exceptional. ### The mythical "Roches Blanches"

This former mansion, built in 1887 close to the sea, takes its name from the limestone rocks that line the coast from Cassis to Marseille. It enjoys a unique location between the village and the Calanques and commands a breathtaking view of the cliffs of the Cap Canaille. It is only in the early 1920s that the property was converted into a hotel and opened to the public. Winston Churchill, and later Edith Piaf, stayed here. The rooms embody the Art Deco simplicity of the historic building with elegance and refinement.

Today, Les Roches Blanches is home to an exceptional setting and is a remarkable hotel and gastronomic experience. The establishment was awarded 2 Michelin Keys in 2024, as well as the Gault & Millau distinction for legendary hotels.

The restaurant menu features 4 experiences open to all. The "Belles Canailles" dining experience, orchestrated by chef Nicolas Sintes for a unique gastronomic treat, punctuated by the sweets of pastry chef Valentin Fabry. The "Rocco", for antipasti & mezze lovers. The "Loup Bar", for lovers of "crudo" cuisine (in season only). And finally, "La Pétanque", open on warm days, where you can enjoy the view from aperitif time to late evening, in the shade of the umbrella pines. DJ sets, ask for the programme!


